1. Introduction

Finnair Group (“Finnair”) connects Europe, North America, and Asia, bringing people, cultures, and economies together daily. As one of the world’s oldest continuously operating airlines, Finnair is committed to conducting business in a sustainable manner and upholding high environmental, social, and governance (ESG) standards.

This Sustainable Procurement Statement reflects Finnair’s commitment to sustainable sourcing and responsible business practices and provides a public summary of the sustainability-related principles, commitments, and expectations set out in Finnair’s internal Procurement Policy. While the Procurement Policy defines binding requirements, this Statement offers external stakeholders a transparent overview of how environmental, social, and economic considerations are integrated into Finnair’s procurement practices and support the company’s broader sustainability ambition.

The Statement applies to all procurement activities aligned with Finnair Procurement Policy Scope.

1.1 Relationship to other policies and commitments

This statement is aligned with Finnair’s internal Procurement policy, approved by Finnair Executive Board, and with Finnair’s Code of Conduct, Supplier Code of Conduct, Policy Commitment to Human Rights and Environmental Policy.

2. Principles

2.1 Environmental sustainability

Finnair is committed to minimising the environmental impact of its operations and value chain. We are committed to the airline industry’s common goal of achieving net zero flying in 2050 and to improving our emission efficiency in line with science-based target setting. We also apply circular economy principles in our operations to reduce waste and promote resource efficiency. Our environmental priorities in procurement are:

- **Climate change mitigation:** We currently encourage suppliers to reduce greenhouse gas emissions and improve energy efficiency. Over time, and where category-relevant, we will integrate greenhouse gas emissions performance into procurement decisions, including preferential scoring for suppliers with credible decarbonization plans.
- **Promoting circular economy:** We encourage suppliers to adopt circular economy principles by designing for reuse, minimising waste, and supporting closed-loop systems that reduce environmental impact across the product lifecycle.
- **Transparency:** We value suppliers who can share environmental data, including carbon emissions.



2.2 Social sustainability

Finnair is committed to respecting all internationally recognised human rights, including those set out in the International Bill of Human Rights and the International Labour Organization's Declaration on Fundamental Principles and Rights at Work. We strive to ensure that we work with suppliers who:

- **Protect Labour & Human rights:** Suppliers shall follow fair labour practices, including the prohibition of forced and child labour, safe working conditions, and respect for diversity and inclusion. Suppliers shall support freedom of association and ensure fair wages. We also encourage positive engagement with local communities.
- **Protect Data Privacy:** Suppliers shall handle personal data responsibly and in compliance with applicable data protection laws, ensuring the privacy and security of all stakeholders.

2.3 Economic responsibility

Finnair's procurement practices aim to create long-term value for the company and its stakeholders. Guided by sustainable value creation, we:

- Promote efficient use of resources, fair competition and transparent procurement processes.
- Encourage innovation and continuous improvement in sustainability performance.
- Expect suppliers to demonstrate financial integrity and responsible business conduct.

3. Implementation, monitoring and review

Finnair integrates sustainability into procurement through:

- Diligent supplier selection and contractual measures, including requirement to comply with the Finnair Supplier code of conduct
- Risk management and due diligence processes aligned with the UN Guiding Principles on Business and Human Rights.
- Continuous risk-based monitoring of supplier sustainability performance and compliance, including media monitoring, assessments, and grievance mechanisms.

This statement is reviewed annually and updated to reflect any changes in Finnair policies and operating environment.
